



Condors Soccer Club Brings New Coaching Talent to the Central Coast

Former International Club Players Join the Ranks of Elite Coaches Training Local Soccer Athletes

ARROYO GRANDE, CA – March 9, 2009 – The Central Coast’s oldest soccer club, the Central Coast Condors, today announced seven new additions to its coaching staff, including two with extensive international experience, and several with collegiate-level experience. The high caliber of these new coaches will support the continued evolution of the Condors into an elite soccer club dedicated to maximizing the potential of local athletes, and enabling players to compete at the local, state and national levels.

“We’re thrilled that so many high-quality coaches have chosen to bring their valuable talents and years of experience to the Central Coast Condors,” noted Lauren Inouye, Director of Coaching for the Central Coast Condors. “The real beneficiaries of this talent will be our local children, as we open up more opportunities for girls and boys to participate in the club soccer experience across all age groups.” With the addition of the new coaches, the roster of Condors teams now totals fourteen, including new teams for U10 girls, U12 girls, U9 boys, and U15 boys.

Central Coast families interested in taking advantage of this new coaching talent should note that tryouts for all Central Coast Condors soccer teams will take place on March 14 at Biddle Park, and March 15, 17, and 19 at Talley Fields, in Arroyo Grande. Inouye also noted that the Central Coast Condors has expanded its involvement with the U.S. Special Olympics and the elite soccer program One Premiere, to provide local athletes with the opportunity to improve their skills and give back to disadvantaged children in the local community. The Condors organization is partnering for the third time with the Special Olympics to host its annual adult and youth special games this summer, to give special athletes on the Central Coast a chance to learn from and play with local club players.

The Condors are also partnering with the elite One Premiere School to offer several training camps to local club players, including a mini-camp for Condors players over the 2009 spring break, and a 2009 summer session in San Luis Obispo open to all players. - Doug MacMillan – MacMillan played soccer in Italy, and coached youth and adult teams locally for 20 years. He will now coach the Condors Girls U10 team.
- Kuziwa Chaniwa – A native of Africa, Chaniwa played collegiate soccer at Moorpark and Cal Lutheran, and competed professionally in Africa before relocating to the Central Coast. Chaniwa will co-coach the Condors Boys U15 team.
- Brad Bowdy – The Arroyo Grande High School Boys’ Varsity Coach, Bowdy will coach the Condors Boys U15 team.
- Drew Arnold- Twenty plus years coaching experience in Cal South. USSF "D" National License and NSCAA Advance Regional License. Arnold will be coaching the Girls U13 team.
- Jeff Ferber – Ferber played collegiate soccer at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, and coached locally for the last 10 years. Ferber will coach the Condors Girls U12 team.
- Adam Goodge – An athletic trainer and youth club player, Goodge will co-coach the Condors Boys U10 team.
- Kent Hubert – A competitive soccer player and high school wrestling and little league baseball coach, Hubert will co-coach the Condors Boys U9 team.
